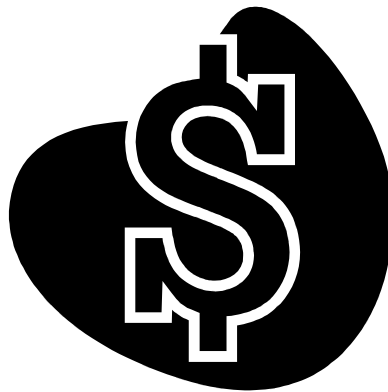
WALNUT VALLEY KIWANIS CLUB

Victor Caceres, a native of Peru, Rotarian, and President of the Pomona Chamber of Commerce, spoke on the Boys and Girls Club of Pomona. The Boys Club, founded in 1860 in Connecticut as the Dash Away, became the Boys Club in 1906 and the Boys and Girls Club in 1990. The club started in Pomona in 1964 and have served 100,000 children to date. There are six sites around the city with 700-800 children per day served during the school year; summer, approximately 400 children per day. They do have a national partnership with Kiwanis. Kiwanis Pomona provides their Friends Breakfast. Pomona schools have an overall dropout rate of 39% with 50% in 9th and 10th grades. The club reaches out to those kids who are not being reached otherwise. After-school study assistance is provided with a great emphasis on reading. A Comedy Night will be held on July 25 at the Improv beginning at 2:00 p.m. This is a fund raiser for a trip to Africa. We're welcome to stop by the clubhouse at 1420 South Garey Avenue and enjoy a tour guided by the kids.

A winning opportunity was selected for Aggie, but she left the Joker in the pile. Hail, Kiwanis!
