The Diamond Bar Library is one of the few “Family Place” libraries, providing toys for younger children and presentations on parenting. The Teen Program includes occasional performers, animated computer programs, and videos. The Friends of the Library Wine Soiree and occasional performances fall into the Adult Program. The library sees about 50,000 visitors annually. The library provides WIFI connection and is open Monday through Thursday from noon to 9:00 p.m.; Friday and Saturday, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The library is closed on Sundays. Their on-line connection is www.colapublib.org. In October the library will join with the Pomona Library to sponsor a Jack London *Call of the Wild* program that will include a dog sled team.
