Kiwanis One Day will be held in April and our own Trudy Brandt is the Division 35 coordinator.

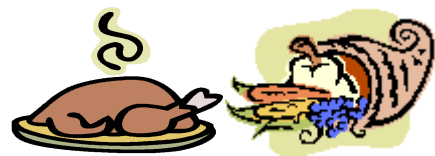
